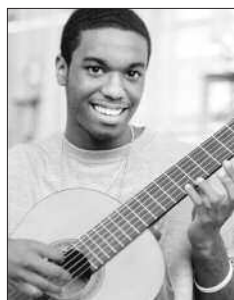

they'll use throughout life. These are programs you may not have heard about, because they don't make a lot of noise. Sort of like the soft lilt of a classical guitar.

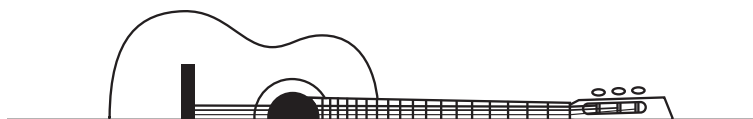
