

On April 21, Dominion reached an historic agreement to make this space significantly cleaner.

Since 2000, Dominion has been working closely with the EPA, the state of West Virginia, and other government agencies on an historic agreement. The result is one of the most comprehensive efforts ever by an energy company to improve air quality.

Dominion agreed to make \$1.2 billion in environmental improvements, including new state-of-the-art pollution controls at its largest coal-fired power stations in West Virginia and Virginia. Sulfur and nitrogen emissions will be reduced by two-thirds. In addition, Dominion has committed \$14 million to environmental projects such as energy and land conservation, including \$2 million toward the purchase of the Cheat River Gorge conservation area.

The impact of this agreement on the air quality where we all live, work and play will be very positive. But the financial impact on our customers will be zero.
